

On September 27th, 2005, Channel 12 News once again featured Fromer Eye Centers, this time highlighting the latest in cataract surgery. Dr. Mark Fromer was interviewed by news correspondent, Tom Wait. He spoke about how most patients who undergo cataract surgery are still forced to rely on reading glasses or bifocals to see clearly close up. However, a breakthrough in implant surgery is now allowing cataract patients an excellent chance of freedom from glasses. The ReSTOR® IOL is the first lens that enables cataract patients to see significantly better at all distances (near, far, and in between ) without reading glasses or bifocals.

Dr. Fromer also spoke about the importance of eye care, especially in the high-risk populations, such as in the African American and Hispanic communities. The news segment stressed the importance of early detection, and regular eye examination.
